I am going there again on Tuesday so if you write soon he might let me [ulæseligt] there.

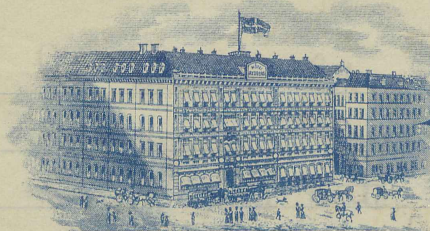
It was a very great pleasure to meet Mrs. Willumsen and yourself, and I look forward with great interest to seeing you at my return to København. With best regards, Believe me
